This Public Bill originated in the House of Representatives, and, having this day passed as now printed, is transmitted to the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for its concurrence.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Railways Improvements Authorisation Act, Tible. 1904.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand 5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Railways Improvements short Title.

Authorisation Act, 1907.

2. In addition to the sums authorised to be raised by the Rail- Authority to raise 10 ways Improvements Authorisation Act, 1904, the Colonial Treasurer £150,000. is hereby empowered from time to time to raise on the security of and charged upon the public revenues of New Zealand, for the purposes authorised by the said Act, sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand pounds, and not 15 exceeding in any financial year the sum of seventy-five thousand pounds:

Provided that to the extent to which the full sum of seventyfive thousand pounds is not raised in any one financial year to the same extent the sums raised in any subsequent financial year may

20 exceed seventy-five thousand pounds.

3. The sums so raised shall bear interest at such rate not Rate of interest. exceeding four and a half per centum per annum as the Colonial Treasurer prescribes, and shall be raised under and subject to the provisions of the New Zealand Loans Act, 1904.

25 4. The sums so raised shall be dealt with and expended in Expenditure of accordance with the provisions of the Railways Improvements moneys. Authorisation Act, 1904.
