A BILL INTITULED

An Act to regulate the Inspection of Public Schools.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The School Inspection Act, Short Title. 1884."

2. This Act shall be read with and as part of "The Education Act to be read as Act, 1877."

3. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of January, When Act to come one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five.

4. All Inspectors of Public Schools shall be appointed by the Governor to appoint Governor, and all Inspectors holding appointments at the time of Inspectors. coming into operation of this Act shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Governor, who shall have all the powers conferred on the Education Boards by "The Education Act, 1877," for the appointment or removal of such Inspectors.

5. The Inspectors so appointed shall, not less than once in every Removal of three years, be removed from one education district to some other Inspectors. district.

6. From and after the coming into operation of this Act the Government to salaries of School Inspectors and all cost of inspection shall be defrayed defray costs, and by the Minister of Education, but shall be recoverable from the Boards. Boards of the several education districts.
