A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Sale of Goods Act, 1908.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the Sale of Goods Amendment Act, 1910, and shall form part of and be read together with the Sale of Goods Act, 1908.

Short Title.

2. Section fifty-nine of the Sale of Goods Act, 1908, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following subsections :—

Section 59 of Sale of Goods Act, 1908, amended.

“(6.) Every lot shall be sold to the highest bidder, and it shall not be lawful for any auctioneer to refuse to accept a bid from any person present at the sale who is willing, or who states that he is willing, to pay cash for the goods on delivery thereof; and any condition or stipulation in conditions of sale in any manner violating this provision shall be void and of no effect.

“(7.) In the account of any sale by auction rendered by the auctioneer to the person on whose behalf the sale takes place there shall be stated the name of the purchaser of each lot submitted for sale.”
