## TRAMWAYS ACT AMENDMENT.

## A BILL INTITULED

An Act to authorise the use of Electricity as a Motor on Tramways. Title. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-5 lows:

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Tramways Act Amend-Short Title. ment Act, 1893." It shall be read together with "The Tramways Act, 1872" (herein referred to as "the said Act"), subject to all

provisions of any Act passed in amendment of the said Act.

2. In the construction and for the purposes of this Act the term Interpretation. "road" shall mean not only any carriage-way being a public highway, and the carriage-way of any bridge forming part of or leading to the same, but shall include the footways and channels (if any) on either side of such carriage-way; but no post, pole, standard, strut or other 15 above-ground contrivance shall be erected or constructed in any road except in the kerbing or such other parts thereof as shall be specified in the order authorising the same.

3. Any order authorising the construction of a tramway, or any Local authority may further order revoking, amending, extending, or varying such order, electricity on 20 may prescribe electricity as the power by which the carriages used on tramways. the tramway authorised by such order may be moved, provided that such order or further order shall also prescribe the system, whether overhead or otherwise, upon or according to which the electricity is

to be applied and used.

4. For enabling electricity to be applied and used as the moving Also the appliances power, any such order or further order, notwithstanding anything to electricity for the the contrary contained in the said Act, may authorise,-

(1.) The suspension, construction, maintenance, and use in over along and across roads, of a wire or wires, conductor or No. 143—1.

for conducting such

conductors, or any other means for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity, and of any casing, coating, tubing, pipe, covering, or insulator enclosing,

surrounding, or connecting the same.

(2.) The erection, construction, maintenance, and use in and along roads, of any posts, poles, standards, struts, or other above-ground contrivance for carrying, suspending, supporting, or rendering effective any such wire conductor or other means.

(3.) The erection, construction, maintenance, and use of such 10 other works, apparatus, and contrivances, and the doing of all such acts and things, as shall be deemed necessary or desirable for effectively and safely applying and using electricity as aforesaid, upon or according to the system 15

prescribed by the order authorising the same.

5. There shall be a Board of Control for the purposes of this Act, which shall consist of the Governor in Council.

The Board of Control may appoint such officers and make such by-laws for their own guidance as they shall think proper. They may also make such rules and regulations as they may think 20 expedient for securing the safety of the public from personal injury or from fire or otherwise, and may from time to time amend or repeal any such regulations, and any such regulations so made or amended by the Board of Control shall, from the date and issue thereof, have the same effect in every respect as though they had been originally 25 inserted in this Act, and every regulation so repealed shall from and after the date thereof be repealed accordingly; but such repeal shall not affect any liability or penalty incurred in respect thereof prior to the date of such repeal, or any proceeding or remedy which might have been had in relation thereto.

The Board of Control may, from time to time, delegate all or any of the powers vested in the Board by this Act to the Electric

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Telegraph Commissioner.

6. All consents given by local authorities prior to the passing of this Act to orders authorising the use as a motive-power of electricity 35 contravention of this on the overhead system, and the terms and conditions in consideration of which such consents have been given, shall, in so far only as the said consents, or any of them, do not authorise any thing to be done in contravention of any of the provisions of this Act, be and be deemed to be as valid and effectual as if this Act had been in force at 40 the respective times such consents were given and such terms and conditions agreed to.
