A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Town Districts Boards Act, 19068. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as 5 follows:-

1. This Act may be cited as the Town Districts Boards Amendment Short Title. Act, 1908, and shall be read together with and form part of the Town Districts Boards Act, 19068 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Sections seventeen fourteen, fifteen, and eighteen of the Repeal.

principal Act are hereby repealed.

3. (1.) The qualifications of an elector shall be those prescribed Qualification of by the Municipal Corporations Act, 19008, for electors under that Act. New subclause.

(2.) Sections six to sixteen of the Municipal Corporat ons Act, 1908, shall, mutatis mutandis, apply to Town Boards.

4. (1.) The members of the Board shall be elected by the Mode of election. electors of the district in the manner prescribed by the Local Elections and Polls Act, 19048, all the provisions of which Act shall 20 apply.

(2.) Every such elector shall have one vote and no more.

5. Section nineteen of the principal Act is hereby amended by repealing the words "from the aforesaid electoral rolls of ridings of 25 counties," and also the words "and shall enter therein the number of votes which each elector is entitled to."

New clause.

5. (1.) Section sixteen of the principal Act is hereby amended Sections 16 and 17 by repealing the words "from the valuation roll of the district."

(2.) All references to ratepayers and the ratepayers roll in sections sixteen and seventeen of the principal Act shall hereafter be deemed to be references to electors and the electors roll.
