A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Town Districts Act, 1906.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 5
1. This Act may be cited as the Town Districts Amendment Act, 1908, and shall be read together with and form part of the Town Districts Act, 1906 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 10 2. Sections seventeen and eighteen of the principal Act are hereby repealed.
3. The qualifications of an elector shall be those prescribed by the Municipal Corporations Act, 1900, for electors under that Act.
- 15 4. (1.) The members of the Board shall be elected by the electors of the district in the manner prescribed by the Local Elections Act, 1904, all the provisions of which Act shall apply.
- (2.) Every such elector shall have one vote and no more.
- 20 5. Section nineteen of the principal Act is hereby amended by repealing the words "from the aforesaid electoral rolls of ridings of counties," and also the words "and shall enter therein the number of votes which each elector is entitled to."
