A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable the Council of the City of Wellington to take over certain existing Private Streets and Rights-of-way and to extend Streets. Title.

5 BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Wellington City Streets Act, 1899." Short Title.

10 2. It shall be lawful for the Council of the City of Wellington, in the manner and subject to the conditions mentioned in section two hundred and sixty-five of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," to declare any now existing private street or right-of-way laid out in the City of Wellington at any time, and of whatever width, to be a public street of such city, and thereupon such private street or right-of-way shall become a public street accordingly. Existing private streets may be declared public streets.

15 3. It shall be lawful for the Council of the City of Wellington to lay out and construct within the said city any public street of a less width than sixty-six feet: Provided, first, that such public street be laid out as and for an extension of, or in continuation of, some then existing street; and, secondly, that the width of the public street so to be laid out shall not be less than that of the street in extension or continuation of which the same shall have been laid out. Public streets may be continued as of their original width.
