A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to regulate the Width of Streets and Roads. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Width of Streets and Roads Act, 1879." Short Title.

2. Every street and road laid out or surveyed after the passing of this Act shall be not less than sixty-six feet wide, measured at right angles to the course thereof. Streets and roads to be 66 feet wide.

3. The owner of lands which are laid out or surveyed in contravention of this Act, and the surveyor who has laid out or surveyed such lands, shall respectively be liable to a penalty of five pounds for each day during which such contravention continues, which penalty may be recovered at any time in a summary manner before two Justices of the Peace by any person who may sue for the same. Penalty for contravention.

4. This Act shall not apply within boroughs, nor to any road which a Road Board or other local body or private individual may acquire by purchase or otherwise through private lands. Exceptions.
