## WAR PENSIONS AMENDMENT BILL (NO. 3)

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

Clause 1 relates to the Short Title.

Clause 2 increases the rates of mothers' allowances payable in conjunction with war widows' pensions, and of family maintenance allowances payable in conjunction with economic pensions and war veterans' allowances, on and after 8 July 1970.

Mothers' allowances are increased by \$1 a week for the first or only dependent child, and 50c a week for each additional dependent child.

Family maintenance allowances payable to unmarried persons are increased by \$1 a week for the first or only dependent child, and 50c a week for each additional dependent child.

Family maintenance allowances payable to married persons. Prior to 8 July 1970, no allowance was paid in respect of a first or only dependent child. An allowance of \$1 a week is payable on and after that date. The allowance for a second dependent child is increased by 75c a week, and for dependent children after the second by 50c a week on and after that date. Thus family maintenance allowances payable to married persons during the period 8 July 1970 to 1 September 1970 were \$1 a week for the first or only dependent child, and \$1.50 a week for each additional dependent child.

Clause 3 increases, on and after 2 September 1970, the following war pensions and allowances:

- (a) Economic pensions payable in conjunction with—
  - (i) Disablement pensions;
  - (ii) Widows' pensions; and
  - (iii) Widowed mothers' pensions:
- (b) Wives' pensions:
- (c) War veterans' allowances and war veterans' allowances gratuities:

Increase of \$1 a week in respect of unmarried persons and, where applicable, \$2 a week in respect of married persons.

- (d) War orphans' pensions:
  - Increase of \$1 a week.
- (e) Mothers' allowances payable in conjunction with war widows' pensions:
- (f) Family maintenance allowances payable in conjunction with economic pensions and war veterans' allowances:

Increase of \$1 a week in respect of the first or only dependent child.

In addition, this clause increases allowable incomes as follows:

In respect of women, with a dependent child or children, receiving war widows' pensions, the allowable income is increased by \$2 a week to \$17 a week.

In other cases, where the allowable income is \$11 a week, the allowable income is increased by \$2 a week to \$13 a week.

Note—The new First, Second, and Ninth Schedules to the principal Act set out in the Schedule to the Bill are unchanged. They are being re-enacted so that all of the Schedules will appear in one Act.

### A BILL INTITULED

#### An Act to amend the War Pensions Act 1954

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, 5 as follows:

- 1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the War Pensions Amendment Act (No. 3) 1970, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the War Pensions Act 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- 2. Increasing rates of mother's allowance and family maintenance allowance in respect of period 8 July 1970 to 1 September 1970—(1) In respect of the period commencing

on the 8th day of July 1970 and ending with the 1st day of September 1970, the principal Act shall have effect as if the Fourth and Eleventh Schedules thereto (as substituted by section 2 of the War Pensions Amendment Act 1970) had been amended in the manner indicated in the First Schedule to this Act.

(2) This section and the First Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the 8th day of July 1970.

- 3. Increasing rates of certain pensions and allowances on 10 and after 2 September 1970—(1) The principal Act is hereby amended by repealing the First to Seventh, Ninth, and Eleventh Schedules (as substituted by section 2 of the War Pensions Amendment Act 1970), and substituting the First to Seventh, Ninth, and Eleventh Schedules set out in the 15 Second Schedule to this Act.
- (2) The War Pensions Amendment Act 1970 is hereby repealed.
- (3) This section and the Second Schedule to this Act shall be deemed to have come into force on the 2nd day of Septem- 20 ber 1970.

Provided that a War Pensions Board may in its discretion refuse to increase any economic pension under this clause in any case where in the opinion of the Board the claimant or pensioner is sharing household expenses with any other person.

### RATES OF WAR VETERANS' ALLOWANCES

  - (a) To a married male veteran who is qualified to receive an allowance on account of his wife, in respect of himself and his wife

- \$1,404 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income of the veteran and his wife (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act) in excess of \$676 a year.
- \$702 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income of the veteran and her husband (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act received by the female veteran) in excess of \$1,378 a year.
- (c) In any other case .....
- \$702 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act) of the veteran and his wife (if any) in excess of \$1,378 a year in the case of a married veteran and in excess of \$676 a year in the case of an unmarried veteran.

  - (a) Where a married male veteran and his wife have both attained the age of 65 years
- \$156 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income of the veteran and his wife (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act) in excess of \$520 a year.
- (b) Where a married female veteran has attained the age of 65 years
- \$78 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income of the veteran and her husband (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act received by the female veteran) in excess of \$1,300 a year.
- (c) In any other case where the veteran or the wife of a male veteran has attained the age of 65 years
- \$78 a year, diminished by \$2 for every complete \$2 of the total annual income of the veteran and his wife (if any) (exclusive of any allowance under Part VI of this Act) in excess of \$598 a year.
- Under section 74—
   Special allowance where veteran dies leaving widow or dependent child

Not exceeding \$1,276.60 a year.

4. General-

The rates specified in clause 1 of this Schedule shall be increased by \$65 a year in any case where the person claiming or in receipt of the allowance is an unmarried person:

Provided that a War Pensions Board may in its discretion refuse to increase any allowance under this clause in any case where in the opinion of the Board the person claiming or in receipt of the allowance is sharing household expenses with any other person.
