LICENSING ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. HOLMES, in Committee, to move the following additions and amendments :—

1. That clause 11 of "The Licensing Act, 1881," be altered, so as to enable the Governor to nominate Licensing Committees, instead of their being elected as at present.
2. To repeal subsections 2 and 4 of clause 29 of said Act.
3. To insert the word "eleven," in place of the word "ten" in clause 30 of the said Act, and to alter clause 154, to make it correspond with the said amendment.
4. To alter subsection 14 of clause 44 of said Act, so as to read "may be reconsidered."
5. To erase the word "whomsoever," in clause 155 of said Act, and substitute the words "excepting boarders and lodgers."
6. To alter clause 155 of the said Act, so that it may read convictions "may be recorded," instead of convictions "shall be recorded."
7. To repeal clause 205 of said Act.
8. To repeal subsections 2 and 3 of clause 207 of said Act.

ALIENS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. SMITH, in Committee, to move the addition of the following new clause :—

Fee on naturalization reduced.

The fee to be paid henceforth in respect of the enrolment of letters of naturalization by the Colonial Secretary shall be two shillings and sixpence for such enrolment, in lieu of one pound as heretofore appointed.
