ANIMALS PROTECTION ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. LANG, in Committee, to move to add the following new clause:—

Any person in *bonâ fide* occupation of any land, not being Crown lands, or any person appointed by him from time to time in writing, may take or kill game or native game upon any lands so occupied by such first-mentioned person within the periods allowed under this Act, and subject to the conditions for the time being imposed on holders of licenses under this Act for the taking or killing of such game, and shall not be liable to any penalty for so doing.

Mr. HOUSTON to move the addition of the following proviso and new clause:—

Proviso to clause 2: Provided that there shall be a close season every three years for native pigeons.

New clause.

Notwithstanding anything contained in clause two, it shall be lawful for the *bonâ fide* owner of land to shoot or destroy without a license any imported game, in or out of season, that may be destroying his crops.

Mr. O'REGAN, in Committee, to move to add the following new clause after clause 4:—

Any one guilty of an infringement of the *last-preceding* section, or of taking or killing Native birds for any purpose whatsoever, without the previous consent, in writing, of the Colonial Secretary, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding *one hundred* pounds, or, in default, imprisonment for a period not exceeding *twelve* months.
