Courts and Criminal Matters Bill

Proposed motion to divide Bill into 9 Bills

Hon Rick Barker, in Committee, to move as follows:

That the enacting words, *clauses 1 and 2* and *Part 1* be a separate Bill, and that for the enacting words, *clauses 1 and 2*, the *Part 1* heading, and *clause 3* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Crimes Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Crimes Act 1961¹ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 2* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 2* heading and *clause 6* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Customs and Excise Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Customs and Excise Act 1996² is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 3* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 3* heading and *clause 8* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:**1 Title**

- (1) This Act is the District Courts Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the District Courts Act 1947³ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 4* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 4* heading and *clause 14* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:**1 Title**

- (1) This Act is the Immigration Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Immigration Act 1987⁴ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 5* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 5* heading and *clause 16* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:**1 Title**

- (1) This Act is the Misuse of Drugs Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Misuse of Drugs Amendment Act 1978⁵ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 6* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 6* heading and *clause 18* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Privacy Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Privacy Act 1993⁶ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 7* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 7* heading and *clause 21* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Sentencing Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Sentencing Act 2002⁷ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

That *Part 8* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 8* heading and *clauses 23 and 23A* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Summary Proceedings Amendment Act **2005**.
- (2) In this Act, the Summary Proceedings Act 1957⁸ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

- (1) This Act (except **sections 24 to 33M**) comes into force on the day after the date on which this Act receives the Royal assent.
- (2) **Sections 24, 25, 26 to 32B, 33(1) and (3), 33A, 33B, 33F to 33I and 33K to 33M** come into force on a date to be appointed by Order in Council; and 1 or more orders may be made bringing different provisions into force on different dates.
- (3) Any provision referred to in **subsection (2)** that has not earlier been brought into force under comes into force on a day that is 6 months after the date that this Act receives the Royal assent.
- (4) **Sections 25A, 25B, 25C, 33(2), 33C, 33D, 33E, and 33J** come into force on 1 March 2007.

That *Part 9* be a separate Bill, and that for the *Part 9* heading and *clause 34* there be substituted the following enacting words and clauses:

The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

- (1) This Act is the Tax Administration Amendment Act 2005.
- (2) In this Act, the Tax Administration Act 1994⁹ is called “the principal Act”.

2 Commencement

This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.
