COUNTIES VEHICLE LICENSING EXTENSION BILL.

Hon. Mr. SEDDON, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Provision as to traction-engines. 4. Traction-engines shall be vehicles within the meaning of “The Counties Vehicle Licensing Act, 1893,” and this Act, and nothing contained in “The Police Offences Act Amendment Act, 1890,” shall be construed to repeal, prejudice, or affect the power to make by-laws relating to traction-engines conferred by any statute in force at the time of the passing of the said Act, or any by-law made pursuant to such power, but such power and all such by-laws shall coexist with the said Act: Provided that no person shall be punished twice for the same offence.

SEA FISHERIES BILL.

Hon. Mr. WARD, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Clause 70: Add the following paragraph:—

The aforesaid authority of the Native Minister may from time to time be signified by him to any person either generally or specifically, and shall be valid if signified by telegraph or telephone message.

Insert new clauses,—

Penalty for obstructing persons taking oysters.

35A. Every person who obstructs, hinders, or prevents any person from lawfully taking oysters from any oyster-bed is liable for every such offence to a penalty of not less than *twenty* shillings nor more than *twenty* pounds.

Nothing in this section shall be deemed to protect such first-mentioned person from any other punishment to which he may have rendered himself liable by any offence against this section.

Limitation of jurisdiction of Justices.

65A. Only a Stipendiary Magistrate shall have jurisdiction in respect of any offence under this Act which entails a fine or penalty exceeding *fifty* pounds in amount.
