DUNEDIN PUBLIC ABATTOIRS BILL.

Mr. MORRISON, in Committee, to move the following amendments and new clause:—

Section 5. To strike out the words “or beyond,” in the 47th line, and the words “notwithstanding that the same may be within any borough or within a mile of any borough.”

Section 16. To strike out all the words after “The Council,” in the 17th line, and add, “shall have no power to let or farm any abattoir, but shall itself manage and conduct the same.”

Clause 20. To insert the words “or any other” in line 7, between the words “this” and “Act.”

Clause 24. To strike out all the words after “Council,” in the 32nd line, and insert, “shall devote the annual surplus (if any) to the reduction of dues during the ensuing year, to the intent that the Council may not conduct any abattoir for the purpose of profit.”

*New Clause, at end of Bill.*

Compensation shall be paid by the Council to any person whose licensed slaughter-yard is compulsorily closed under this Act, and the amount of such compensation shall be ascertained by reference to arbitrators in the manner provided by “The Arbitration Act, 1890.”
