EIGHT HOURS BILL.

Sir R. Stout, in Committee, to move the following new clause:

No barmaid shall be able to make any agreement or contract whereby she undertakes to work beyond eight hours a day; and any licensed publican allowing any barmaid to work more than eight hours in any one day shall be liable to any penalty not exceeding

twenty pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner.

DISQUALIFICATION ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. Bevan, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

No one in receipt of a pension or allowance from the Imperial Government shall be eligible for, or capable of holding, the office of Premier.

GOVERNMENT LOANS TO LOCAL BODIES ACT AMENDMENT.

Hon. Sir J. Vogel, in Committee, to move the following clause:—

9. It is hereby declared that when a local authority has heretofore adopted or shall hereafter adopt "The Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1886," the power to borrow money under the original Act and raise a special rate as security in respect thereof shall be deemed to have been exercised, and may hereafter be exercised, under the original Act and "The Loans to Local Bodies Act, 1886," without complying with the provisions or requirements of any other Act relating to such power.
