LICENSING BILL.

Mr. MEREDITH, in Committee, to move the following amendments :---

Clause 23, line 11: After the word "granted" insert "or a reduction of licenses shall be made."

Clause 31, line 19: After the word "vessel" insert "and at no other time nor to any other person."

Clause 36, line 10: Strike out the words "the first Wednesday," insert "such one of the first ten days"; and in line 11, after "year" insert "as shall be fixed by the Chairman of the Committee of each district."

Clause 43, line 25: After "respectively" insert "but nevertheless all ballot-papers and voting-papers deposited in the wrong boxes shall be included in the counting of the ballot-papers and the voting-papers respectively"; and in subsection (3) strike out all the words of the subsection after "proposal," in line 45, and insert "or erases both the said words, the voting-paper shall be void."

Clause 47, line 18: After the word "if" insert "three-fifths of the total number of votes of."

Clause 115, line 6 : After "license" insert "and any indorsement on the license to be renewed which the law requires to be transferred to the new license shall be written on the certificate as an instruction to the officer issuing such new license, and such indorsement shall be made on the new license by the aforesaid officer."

Clause 151, line 39: After "Saturday" insert "and on the days on which parliamentary general elections and the polls under this Act are taken, and on the days of any by or particular parliamentary election."

Schedule 8, line 5: After "district" insert "and the name of the owner or mortgagee of the premises."

GOVERNMENT BAILWAYS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. J. W. Kelly, in Committee, to move—

That the following proviso be added to clause 14:---

Provided, however, that every officer and employé shall be entitled to receive leave of absence, such leave of absence to be taken at one time should the said officer or employé so desire, and shall not be for a shorter period than one week in any one year.
