

SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER PAPER.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

WORKMEN'S WAGES ACT 1884 EXTENSION BILL.

Mr. GUINNESS, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

(1.) The master or employer of a servant or workman shall pay to such servant or workman, within two clear days after such servant or workman lawfully ceases to be in the service of such master or employer, the full amount of wages due to such servant or workman.

(2.) In the event of the servant or workman's wages, or any part thereof, not being paid as in the *preceding* section mentioned, then, unless the delay is due to the act or default of the servant or workman or to any reasonable dispute as to liability, or to any other cause not being the act or default of the master or employer, the servant or workman's wages shall continue to run and be payable until the time of final payment or settlement thereof.

REPRESENTATION BILL.

Mr. J. MCKENZIE, in Committee, to move:—

To insert after the word "be," in the first line of subsection 1, clause 3, the words "seventy-one."

Sir G. GREY, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

From and after the passing of this Act, no elector shall be entitled to vote at more than two electorates.

The Returning Officer or Deputy Returning Officer may, and if so required by any scrutineer shall, at any election, before allowing any person to vote, put to such person the following question: Have you already voted at the present election in more than one electoral district? and unless he answers such question in the negative he shall not be permitted to vote, and any person giving a false answer shall be guilty of an offence under this Act.

Any person guilty of an offence under this Act shall be liable on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace to imprisonment for any term not exceeding twelve months.

CHATTEL SECURITIES ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Major STEWARD, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Wherever in the said Act it is provided that an affidavit shall be taken or made before a solicitor of the Supreme Court, such affidavit may be taken or made before a Justice of the Peace.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS BILL.

Major STEWARD, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

From and after the first Wednesday in December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, the County and Borough of Waimate shall cease to be included in the District of South Canterbury, as defined in the First Schedule of the said Act, and shall be and hereby are, as from the said date, together constituted a separate

district by the name of "The Waimate District;" and the District Board for the said District of Waimate shall consist of the Chairman of the County Council of Waimate, the Mayor of the Borough of Waimate, and three members of the County Council and one member of the Borough Council, to be elected by such Councils respectively on the fourth Wednesday in the month of November now next ensuing, and thereafter on the fourth Wednesday in November in each succeeding year.

HARBOURS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. J. McKENZIE, in Committee, to move the following new clauses :—

23. The sum of fifteen hundred pounds, being part of the moneys to the credit of the Moeraki Harbour Board, shall be set aside and is hereby appropriated for the purpose of erecting saltwater baths in the Port of Moeraki.

24. For the purpose of giving effect to the *foregoing* section, the Governor in Council may appoint three persons to be Trustees, to be called "The Moeraki Bath Trustees."

25. The said Trustees shall be a corporate body, and have all the powers corporate bodies possess, and they shall be removable at the pleasure of the Governor.

26. It shall be the duty of the Trustees to expend the aforementioned sum in erecting the said baths on some site approved by the Minister of Marine, and also to make regulations for the managing and using of said baths, and for providing who may have access to them. Such regulations shall be approved by the Governor before coming into operation.
