## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

# Wednesday, the 9th day of June, 1880.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS BILL.

1. Mr. Hutchison, in Committee, to move as follows:—

That all the clauses from 4 to 28 inclusive be omitted, and the following substituted therefor:—

A. Every county and borough shall be liable for the relief of all destitute persons resident therein, and for this purpose shall assume the maintenance of any hospital or charitable-aid institution within their bounds, which shall henceforth be supported either from the ordinary revenue of the counties or boroughs respectively; if necessary, by a special rate, which they are hereby empowered to levy; or by voluntary contributions.

B. "Residence," for the purposes of this Act, shall be constituted by one year's continuous industrial residence in any county or borough respectively.

Persons needing relief, who have not acquired such [industrial] "residence," shall be chargeable to their last known place of abode.

Assisted or nominated immigrants becoming chargeable before the expiry of one year's residence shall be cared for by or made chargeable to the Government.

- C. County and Borough Councils shall make arrangements for obtaining voluntary contributions from the public towards the support either of hospitals or charitable institutions, or both, under their care; and, on obtaining twenty or more voluntary contributors of a guinea and upwards, shall proceed to form an independent Board of Management, composed of a certain number of members of the County or Borough Council and a certain number of contributors, as hereinafter provided.
- D. Grants-in-aid out of any moneys voted by the General Assembly in that behalf shall be made to County and Borough Council toward the support of hospitals and charitable institutions at the rate of pound for pound; and in those cases where the County or Borough Council has proceeded to form an independent Board of Management, such grants-in-aid shall be doubled for the amount obtained by voluntary contributions.
- E. Every such independent Board (to be called "The Aid Board") shall consist of ten members, five of whom shall be a quorum, and shall, with the exception of the Chairman of the county or the Mayor of the borough, who shall be ex officio Chairman of the Board, be elected annually, in manner following:—
  - (a). Four members by and from the Council of the county or borough;
  - (b.) Five members by contributors to the funds of the Board, from among those of their number who shall as donors have paid ten guineas, or as annual subscribers one guinea and upwards.

[The other clauses of the Bill to be amended in conformity with these clauses.]

#### LICENSING BILL.

2. Mr. Pitt, in Committee, to move the insertion of the following new clauses relating to the granting of bottle licenses at a fee of £30, and accommodation licenses:—

Section 29, after line 27, insert:

- (8.) Bottle license.
- (9.) Accommodation license.

New sections after 36:-

A bottle license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of any intoxicating liquor on the premises therein specified, in bottles corked and sealed, capsuled or wired, of sizes not less than those of which six or twelve are usually reckoned to the gallon, and not to be drunk in or upon the house or premises for which such license is granted.

An accommodation license shall authorize the licensee to sell and dispose of any intoxicating liquor on the premises therein specified, and such license may be granted on the terms of repairing or keeping in repair any road or bridge in the vicinity of such premises, keeping a ferry, or providing good accommodation for travellers, or on such of the former or such other terms as the Licensing Committee shall think fit, including the payment of a fee of not exceeding twenty pounds, to be fixed by the Licensing Committee.

Section 100, after line 32, insert:

- (8.) For a bottle license, thirty pounds:
- (9.) For an accommodation license, any sum as shall be named therein not exceeding *twenty* pounds, to be fixed by the Licensing Committee when granting the license.

### Accommodation License.

Whereas the Licensing Committee, holding the licensing meeting at day of , have, by their certificate dated the day of , authorized the issue to , of , of an accommodation license for the place and upon the conditions hereinafter mentioned: And , as the fee hath paid into my office the sum of whereas the said on such license: Now I do hereby declare that the said is licensed to sell intoxicating liquors in any quantity in the premises situate at , but not elsewhere, subject to the conditions following, that is to say [Set out the conditions: This license shall commence upon the day of and continue in force until the day of then next ensuing, both inclusive, provided the said several conditions shall be so long fulfilled by the holder hereof, and his license be not forfeited in the meantime.
