NELSON CROWN LANDS RELIEF BILL.

Mr. O'CONNOR, in Committee, to move:—

Line 6. After the word "Act," to insert the following: "Also under 'The Crown Lands (Nelson) Leasing Act, 1867,' and the provisions of section twenty-seven of the said Act."

Line 21. After "1874," insert "And the provisions of section twenty-seven of 'The Crown Lands (Nelson) Leasing Act, 1867.'"

Line 26. Strike out the words "thirty days," and insert in lieu thereof the words "six months."

HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITUTIONS ACT 1885 AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. DARGAVILLE, in Committee, to move that:—

The First Schedule of the said Act is hereby amended as follows: In the description of the North of Auckland District, after the words "Bay of Islands," omit the word "and"; and after the word "Hokianga" add the words "Whangarei, Hobson, and Otamatea." In the description of the District of Auckland omit the words "Hobson, Whangarei."

Mr. BUCHANAN, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

Subsection five of section thirty-four of the said Act is hereby repealed, and the Wairarapa District and the Wellington District are hereby constituted charitable aid districts under the said Act as if they had never formed part of any united district.

The Board of the United Board of the Wairarapa District and the Wellington District is hereby dissolved, and all the assets and liabilities of such united district at the time of its dissolution shall be apportioned among the Boards of the two districts forming part of such united district, in manner as shall be allocated by such person as the Governor may appoint for this purpose.

This section shall not come into force before the first day of April next after the passing hereof.

HARBOURS ACT 1878 AMENDMENT BILL.

Captain SUTTER, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

Subsection eight of section one hundred and thirty-two of "The Harbours Act, 1878," is hereby repealed.
