## LICENSING BILL.

Mr. Lawry, in Committee, to move, in the event of clause 3, subsection (3) of the Licensing Bill being struck out, to substitute the following new subsection:—

Whereas it has been deemed expedient to prohibit the sale of wine, cider, and perry, the produce of grapes, apples, pears, or other fruits grown in New Zealand: And whereas the prohibition of the sale of the aforesaid wine, cider, and perry will cause great loss to the fruit-growers of New Zealand: The said fruit-growers shall respectively be deemed to, and shall, have the right to respectively claim and obtain compensation for loss as aforesaid; the amount of such compensation to be based upon fair and competent valuation. The money for the payment of such compensation shall be provided for and paid out of the Consolidated Revenue of the colony.
