LAW REFORM BILL

Proposed Amendments

HON. MR McLAY, in Committee, to move the following amendments:

That *clauses 2 and 3* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 2* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Administration Act 1969 relating to nominations of accounts

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Administration Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Administration Act 1969 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 4 and 5* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 4* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948 relating to nominations of accounts

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Trustee Savings Banks Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Trustee Savings Banks Act 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 6 and 7* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 6* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Post Office Act 1959 relating to nominations of accounts

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Post Office Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Post Office Act 1959 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 8 and 9* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 8* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Crimes Act 1961 relating to evidence of identification

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Crimes Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Crimes Act 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 10 and 11* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 10* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Summary Proceedings Act 1957 relating to evidence of identification

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Summary Proceedings Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 12 and 13* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 12* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Evidence Act 1908 relating to evidence of identification

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Evidence Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Evidence Act 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 14 to 20* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 14* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Property Law Act 1952

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Property Law Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Property Law Act 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) Section 4 (2) of this Act shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1983.

(3) Except as provided in <u>subsection (2)</u> of this section, this Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.

That *clauses 25 and 26* be a separate Bill, and that for *clause 28* there be substituted the following Title, enacting words, and Short Title:

An Act to amend the Trustee Act 1956 relating to trustees' powers in respect of businesses forming the whole or part of the trust assets

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title and commencement—(1) This Act may be cited as the Trustee Amendment Act 1982, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Trustee Act 1956 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the 28th day after the date on which it receives the Governor-General's assent.
