NATIONAL ENDOWMENT BILL.

Mr. WILFORD to move the following amendment :—

A. The Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any lands now or hereafter reserved for any of the purposes of this Act, except lands included under the provisions of Parts V and VI of the Land Act, 1892, shall be disposed of by way of sale in fee-simple, subject to the limitations as to the area which may be acquired by any one person provided in the Land Laws Amendment Act, 1907. Upon such Proclamation being issued the lands mentioned therein shall be sold in like manner in all respects as if they were Crown lands of a similar character or class, and the Commissioner, on behalf of the Board, shall execute a transfer or conveyance thereof to the purchaser; and the proceeds of every such sale, after deducting all expenses of survey and other expenses incurred by the Board or by the Government in connection with such land, shall be invested in other lands situated within ten miles of a town or borough having not less than five thousand inhabitants; and such land when so acquired shall become part of the national endowment hereinbefore referred to.
