PHARMACY BILL.

Hon. Mr. Seddon, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

The Governor may, by Order in Council, make, alter, and revoke regulations for the licensing or registration of persons (to be called "licensed druggists") to whom, in the opinion of the Governor, the whole of the provisions of this Act should not apply, and may in and by any such Order prescribe—

(a.) The several conditions under which such license or registration may be granted, the rights conferred by registration, and what fees (if any) shall be payable by applicants in

respect of registration, or otherwise;

(b.) What provisions of this Act, or what portion of such provisions, shall be applicable to such persons as aforesaid.
 And the Governor may, by such regulations, impose a penalty not

exceeding twenty pounds for any breach thereof.

THE SHIPPING AND SEAMEN'S ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. G. W. Russell, in Committee, to move the following new clause:

Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Chinese Immigrants Act, 1881," and the Acts amending the same, the master of every vessel having on board any Chinese as part of the crew shall be required to deposit with the Collector of Customs at the port of arrival the amount of the poll-tax payable under the said Act, which shall be repayable at the port of departure on proof that the same Chinese continue part of the crew at the time of departure.
