

SUPPLEMENTARY ORDER PAPER.

HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Tuesday, the 2nd day of September, 1873.

1. Sir CRACROFT WILSON, in Committee on the Protection of Animals Bill, to move the following amendments,—

Clause 10, line 16, to omit the words “fifteenth day of May and the fifteenth day of August,” and to insert in their stead the words “first day of May and thirty-first day of July, both inclusive.”

Clause 11, to add the following words at the end of the clause:—
“or such months as may be from time to time proclaimed by the Superintendent.”

Also, to add the following new clauses:—

30. If any person shall be found offending against the provisions of the fifteenth, sixteenth, twenty-fifth, twenty-sixth, twenty-seventh, and twenty-ninth sections of this Act, he shall give his name and address, and shall deliver up any game or native game to any authorized person who may demand the same; and if he shall refuse so to give his name and address, and to deliver up such game or native game as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for any such authorized person, with any assistance he may require, and for any constable, to take such person into custody, and also to take possession of any gun or other weapon or instrument or net or other means used to kill or destroy any game or native game, which may be in the possession of any person so offending as aforesaid; and such person, with such game or native game, and with such gun or other weapon or instrument or net as aforesaid, shall forthwith, or as soon as conveniently may be, be taken before the nearest Justice of the Peace, to be dealt with according to law.

Persons offending against certain parts of Act must give name and address, and deliver up game; in default may be arrested with game, gun, &c.

Any person who shall assault or resist any such authorized person so demanding such game native game gun weapon instrument net or other means of destruction, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds, besides any other penalty he may have incurred under this Act.

31. No person shall kill or destroy any game or native game, or shoot at or attempt to shoot at any game or native game, with an instrument known as a swivel gun; and if any person shall offend against this provision he shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, besides any other penalty he may have incurred.
