WATER-SUPPLY ACT, 1891, AMENDMENT BILL.

Mr. MONTGOMERY, in Committee, to move the following addition to clause 12 :—

Any person owning or occupying land, whether within the boundaries of a water-supply district or not, which he has reason to believe will be injuriously affected by the construction of any water-race, may apply to the District Court, if there shall be such a Court exercising jurisdiction in the district, or, if not, to the Supreme Court, for an injunction to prevent such water-race being proceeded with unless adequate provision is made to prevent such land being flooded, waterlogged, or otherwise injuriously affected; and the Court may thereupon grant such injunction or make such order as shall best meet the circumstances of the case.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION FOR ACCIDENT BILL.

Mr. WASON, in Committee, to move,—

In the definition of "worker," in clause 2, to strike out all the words after the word "person" in line 20 down to and including the words "or on" in line 25, and to insert the following in lieu thereof: "employed on railways, or in factories, mines, quarries, or other engineering works, and seamen or those employed on or about."

NOXIOUS WEEDS BILL.

Mr. MORRISON, in Committee, to move the following amendment :—

Section 5, subsection (3): After the word "fences," in line 1, insert the words "or trees planted in close proximity to any boundary-line."
