



Animal Products (Ancillary and Transitional Provisions) Amendment Regulations 2004

Pursuant to section 166 of the Animal Products Act 1999, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Animal Products (Ancillary and Transitional Provisions) Amendment Regulations 2004.
- (2) In these regulations, the Animal Products (Ancillary and Transitional Provisions) Regulations 2000¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 9 July 2004.

3 Regulation 15 revoked

The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 15, and substituting the following regulation:

“15 Maximum permissible residue limits

- “(1) The maximum permissible residue limits for substances present in animal material or animal products are those set out in specifications made for the purpose under the Animal Products Act 1999.
- “(2) This regulation applies to all animal product businesses, whether operating under a registered risk management programme or under the Meat Act regime or otherwise.”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 9 July 2004, revoke and replace regulation 15 of the Animal Products (Ancillary and Transitional Provisions) Regulations 2000. That regulation deals with maximum permissible residue limits for substances present in animal material or animal products by adopting certain provisions of the Meat (Residues) Regulations 1996. These matters are now dealt with in specifications made under the Animal Products Act 1999.
