THE ARMY PAY NOTICE 1964

PURSUANT to section 23B of the New Zealand Army Act 1950, the Minister of Defence, with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, hereby gives the following notice.

NOTICE

1. This notice may be cited as the Army Pay Notice 1964.
2. Except where this notice otherwise provides, this notice shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August 1962.
3. The rates of pay payable to officers and soldiers of the Regular Force, the Territorial Force, and the Emergency Forces shall be those specified in the First, Second, and Third Schedules hereto, and shall be additional to the several allowances that are payable according to circumstances.
