



**THE AGRICULTURAL WORKERS EXTENSION ORDER 1942,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 6th day of April,
1945

Present :

THE HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 20 of the Agricultural Workers Act, 1936, and after submission by the Minister of Labour of the provisions contained in this Order to the organization of the workers of the class affected and the organizations of their employers, and after approval of the said provisions in all material particulars by the said organizations, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers Extension Order 1942, Amendment No. 1.

2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Agricultural Workers Extension Order 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

3. (1) This Order shall come into force on the day following the enactment thereof.

(2) The rates and amounts payable under the principal order as hereby amended shall be payable in respect of work done on or at any time after the 1st day of April, 1945.

4. Clauses 1 and 6 of the Schedule to the principal Order are revoked, and the following clauses respectively substituted therefor :—

“ 1. Except as hereinafter provided, every worker shall be entitled to receive from his employer payment for his work at such rate as is agreed upon, being not less than the appropriate rate as prescribed hereunder :—

“ 6. The rates payable to casual workers shall be as follows :—

5. The Schedule to the principal Order is further amended by adding the following clause :—

“ 11. When any work is done on a Sunday by workers covered by this Order a day off shall be allowed at a time to be mutually arranged between the employer and the worker concerned, save that this provision shall not apply to the milking of cows or to the feeding of animals on Sunday mornings and evenings, such attention to the animals being essential every day of the week. Also the above provisions shall not apply to workers engaged temporarily during the lambing period.”
