



**THE AGRICULTURAL WORKERS WAGE-FIXATION
ORDER 1945**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 5th day of
September, 1945

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Agricultural Workers Act, 1936, and having regard to the prices for the time being fixed under section 20 of the Marketing Act, 1936, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Agricultural Workers Wage-fixation Order 1945.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of August, 1945, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of July, 1946, and thereafter until a further Order in Council is made in substitution therefor pursuant to section 14 of the first aforementioned Act.

3. The Agricultural Workers Wage-Fixation Order (No. 2) 1944* shall be deemed to have been revoked as from the 31st day of July, 1945.

4. The following shall be the minimum rates of wages payable under the said section 14 to agricultural workers employed on dairy-farms :—

(a) For workers under the age of 17 years	1 15 0
(b) For workers of the age of 17 years but under the age of 18 years	2 5 0
(c) For workers of the age of 18 years but under the age of 19 years	2 15 0
(d) For workers of the age of 19 years but under the age of 20 years	3 5 0
(e) For workers of the age of 20 years but under the age of 21 years	3 15 0
(f) For workers of the age of 21 years and upwards	4 5 0

Provided that in the case of those workers who are not provided with board and lodging by their employers the aforesaid rates shall respectively be increased by £1 a week.
