ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 31st day of March 1964

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Bon Accord Harbour Regulations 1964.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. No person shall anchor any ship within 300 ft of submarine telephone cables laid across Bon Accord Harbour, Kawau Island, in a direction 025° from a point of land situated about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile eastward of Momona Point to the opposite shore, the shore-ends of the cables being marked by unlighted beacons each surmounted with a white triangular topmark bearing the word "Cables" in black letters.
