## THE BOARD OF TRADE (WHEAT AND FLOUR) REGULATIONS 1944, AMENDMENT NO. 1

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the provisions of section 26 of the Board of Trade Act, 1919, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Minister of Industries and Commerce, and deeming the provisions hereinafter contained to be necessary in the public interest for divers of the purposes set out in the said section, doth hereby make the following regulations for the purposes of the said Act.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Board of Trade (Wheat and Flour) Regulations 1944 (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1946.
- **4.** Regulation 146 of the principal regulations is amended by inserting, after the words "normal time of harvest", the following words: "or until such time previous thereto as the Committee may in any particular case authorize for the ploughing-in or other disposal of the crop".
- **5.** Regulation 154 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the words "pest-damage", and substituting the words "frost-damage".
- **6.** Regulation 228 of the principal regulations is amended by deleting the amount "1s." wherever it appears, and substituting therefor the amount "1s. 1d.".
