**THE CIVIL AVIATION (ROYAL VISIT)
REGULATIONS 1964**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 3rd day of February 1964

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Civil Aviation Act 1948, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Civil Aviation (Royal Visit) Regulations 1964.

2. (1) In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires,—
“Royal Flight” means the aircraft carrying Her Majesty the Queen Mother or any persons in attendance on Her Majesty:

Terms and expressions defined in the Civil Aviation Regulations 1953* shall, when used in these regulations, have the meanings so defined.

(2) These regulations shall apply to all aircraft registered in or flying over New Zealand except aircraft of the Royal Flight and aircraft appointed to undertake ceremonial, escort, or support duties to the Royal Flight.

3. (1) The Director of Civil Aviation may from time to time, by Notices to Airmen promulgated in such manner as he thinks fit, prescribe temporary control areas and temporary control zones in respect of air routes and aerodromes to be used by the Royal Flight.

(2) Any such temporary control areas shall, in any Notice to Airmen issued under these regulations, be referred to as purple control areas.

(3) Any such temporary control zones shall, in any Notice to Airmen issued under these regulations, be referred to as purple control zones.

(4) Any such Notice to Airmen shall prescribe the period or periods during which any temporary control area or temporary control zone to which it relates shall remain in existence.

(5) The lateral and vertical dimensions of every temporary control area and temporary control zone established pursuant to these regulations shall be defined in the appropriate Notice to Airmen.

(6) Where a temporary control area or a temporary control zone established under these regulations coincides in whole or in part with an existing control area or control zone established by Civil Aviation Safety Order No. 2B, pursuant to the Civil Aviation Regulations 1953, the existing control area or control zone shall be deemed to be subject in all respects to these regulations except so far as the space or area to which it relates is outside the space or area of a temporary control area or temporary control zone.

(7) Danger and restricted areas prescribed in respect of any of the operations of any of Her Majesty's Forces and situated within 5 nautical miles of an area for the time being prescribed under these regulations as a temporary control area or temporary control zone shall not be used in connection with any such operations.

4. The restrictions which apply to aircraft when being flown in a temporary control area or temporary control zone shall be prescribed in the appropriate Notice to Airmen.

5. Except with the permission in writing of the Minister, and in accordance with such conditions as may be specified in the written permission, no aircraft except when landing at or taking off from an aerodrome within a control zone established by Civil Aviation Safety Order No. 2B, pursuant to the Civil Aviation Regulations 1953, shall be flown over or within an area bounded by the circumference of a circle having a radius of 3 nautical miles centred on the place of any open air public gathering attended by Her Majesty the Queen Mother during the period commencing one hour before the advertised arrival at the gathering of the Royal Party and ending one hour after their departure.

6. The restrictions which apply when aircraft are being flown in the vicinity of any ship carrying Her Majesty the Queen Mother, or in the vicinity of any place that is for the time being the residence of Her Majesty the Queen Mother, shall be prescribed in the appropriate Notice to Airmen.

7. With the exception of aircraft engaged on air transport operations and following their normal routes, no aircraft shall be flown at a height of less than 3,000 ft above nor closer than 1 nautical mile horizontally from any vehicle or conveyance for the time being carrying Her Majesty the Queen Mother or members of the Royal Party.

8. (1) Any person who contravenes or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations commits an offence against these regulations.

(2) The owner, the operator, the hirer, and the pilot in command of an aircraft which flies in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any provision of these regulations commits an offence against these regulations:

Provided that where a prosecution is taken under this subclause it shall be a defence to the proceedings for the owner, operator, hirer, or pilot in command to prove that the alleged contravention took place without his actual fault or privity.

(3) Any person who commits an offence against these regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £200 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both.

9. These regulations shall expire with the 9th day of March 1964.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for the establishment of special control areas and control zones in respect of aircraft carrying Her Majesty the Queen Mother and the Royal Party during the Royal visit. Restrictions are imposed on aircraft, other than the Royal Flight, when flying within these areas or zones during specified periods.

Restrictions are also imposed on aircraft flying in the vicinity of ships and conveyances carrying the Royal Party or of open air gatherings at which Her Majesty the Queen Mother will be present.
