Pursuant to section 65 of the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister of Commerce given after consultation with the Chartered Professional Engineers Council, makes the following regulations.

Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Levy Regulations 2004.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 16 September 2004.

3 Application

These regulations apply to the financial year ending on 30 June 2005 and subsequent financial years.

4 Levy

The Registration Authority must pay to the Council, in each financial year of the Council, a levy of \$50,000 under section 64 of the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002.

5 When levy must be paid

- (1) The Registration Authority must pay that levy on or before 14 July in each year.
- (2) However, the first levy must be paid on or before 30 September 2004.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 16 September 2004, provide for the levy that must be paid by the Registration Authority to the Chartered Professional Engineers Council (the **Council**) under the Chartered Professional Engineers of New Zealand Act 2002 (the **Act**).

The Registration Authority is the body under the Act that makes the rules, carries out all the registration functions, maintains the register, and deals with complaints, in relation to chartered professional engineers. All registration charges, fines, and other money payable under the Act must be paid to the Registration Authority. The Council reviews the Registration Authority's rules, hears appeals

from the Registration Authority's decisions, and has reporting functions under the Act. Section 64 of the Act requires the Registration Authority to pay an annual levy to the Council for the performance of the Council's functions.

Under these regulations, the annual levy is set at \$50,000. It must be paid on or before 14 July in each year (that is, 14 days after the commencement of each financial year of the Council). However, the first levy must be paid on or before 30 September 2004 (as the first financial year has already commenced).
