THE CREMATION REGULATIONS 1939, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to the Cemeteries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Cremation Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Cremation Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- 3. These regulations shall come into force on the 30th day of November, 1945.
- 4. Clause (4) of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is revoked.
- 5. Paragraph (a) of clause (6) of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following paragraph substituted:—
 - "(a) In the case of the cremation of human remains following disinterment thereof after burial for not less than one year and in the case of the cremation of the remains of a stillborn child, by the trustees or some person appointed by the trustees in that behalf, or by the Medical Referee."
