ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 28th day of
November, 1945

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Cemeteries Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Cremation Regulations 1939, Amendment No. 1.

2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Cremation Regulations 1939* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).

3. These regulations shall come into force on the 30th day of November, 1945.

4. Clause (4) of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is revoked.

5. Paragraph (a) of clause (6) of Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is revoked, and the following paragraph substituted:—

“(a) In the case of the cremation of human remains following disinterment thereof after burial for not less than one year and in the case of the cremation of the remains of a stillborn child, by the trustees or some person appointed by the trustees in that behalf, or by the Medical Referee.”
