ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Diplomatic Privileges (Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand) Order 1998.

(2) This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—In this order, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“JAS-ANZ” means the Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand.

3. Declaration as to organisation—JAS-ANZ is an organisation of which the governments of 2 or more States are members.

4. Body corporate—JAS-ANZ has the legal capacities of a body corporate.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order declares that the Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand is an international organisation and provides that the organisation has the legal capacities of a body corporate.

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.
