



THE DAIRY SUPPLY CONTROL ORDER 1945

PURSUANT to the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939* the Minister of Agriculture hereby makes the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Dairy Supply Control Order 1945.
2. (1) In this Order—
“Dairy” means a dairy within the meaning of the Dairy Industry Act, 1908 :
“Season” means the period of twelve months commencing on the 1st day of August in any year.
(2) Terms defined in the Dairy-produce Regulations 1938† have, when used in this Order, the meanings respectively assigned thereto in those regulations.

REVOCATION OF FORMER ORDER

3. (1) The Dairy Supply Control Order 1942‡ is hereby revoked.
(2) The revocation of the said Order shall not affect the liability of any person for any offence in relation thereto committed before the coming into force of this Order.

DIRECTIONS AS TO SUPPLY OF MILK AND CREAM TO CREAMERIES AND TO CHEESE-FACTORIES

4. (1) This clause applies with respect to every dairy from which any milk or cream was at any time during the 1944-45 season supplied to a creamery for the manufacture of butter.
(2) Except as otherwise provided in this Order, every person who for the time being is the occupier of a dairy with respect to which this clause applies shall, while this Order continues in force, supply all milk or cream disposed of from that dairy to a creamery the owner or manager of which is not prohibited by any order, determination, or instruction of the Executive Commission of Agriculture for the time being in force under the Dairy Factory Supply Regulations 1936§ from receiving milk or cream produced in that dairy :

Provided that the occupier shall not supply such milk or cream to more than one creamery during the period from the 1st day of August in any year until the 31st day of May in the next succeeding year if the dairy is situated in the North Island, or during the period from the 1st day of September in any year until the 30th day of June in the next succeeding year if the dairy is situated in the South Island.

5. (1) This clause applies with respect to every dairy (not being in any case a dairy with respect to which clause 4 hereof applies) from which any milk was at any time during the 1941-42 season supplied to a cheese-factory for the manufacture of cheese.

(2) Except as otherwise provided in this Order, every person who is for the time being the occupier of a dairy with respect to which this clause applies shall, while this Order continues in force, either—

- (a) Supply all milk or cream disposed of from that dairy to a creamery for the manufacture of butter; or
- (b) Supply all milk disposed of from that dairy to the cheese-factory to which any milk produced in that dairy was supplied during the season referred to in the last preceding subclause. Where during the said season milk from that dairy was supplied to different cheese-factories, all milk disposed of from that dairy, while this Order continues in force, shall be supplied to such one of those factories as is nearest to or is most convenient of access to the dairy.

6. The foregoing provisions of this Order shall not apply in any case where a specific direction to the contrary is given in writing by the Primary Industries Controller or by the Director or the Assistant Director of the Dairy Division of the Department of Agriculture.
