ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 7th day of March 1966

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Workers' Compensation Act 1956, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1966.

2. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 4), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 5 of the Employers' Liability Insurance Regulations 1962, Amendment No. 4, is hereby revoked.
