



Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2004

Pursuant to section 297 of the Fisheries Act 1996, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2004.
- (2) In these regulations, the Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Maximum daily number of fish

Regulation 2B of the principal regulations is amended by revoking subclauses (3) and (3A), and substituting the following subclause:

- “(3) No person may, on any day,—
- “(a) take more than 3 blue cod from within the combined Challenger (East) Area and Marlborough Sounds Area;
 - or
 - “(b) possess more than 3 blue cod taken from within that combined area.”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend the Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986.

The amendment makes it clear that the bag limit of 3 blue cod applies to the combined Challenger (East) Area and Marlborough Sounds Area.
