



Fisheries (Kawhia Aotea Taiapure) Order 2000

Order in Council

At Wellington this 8th day of May 2000

Present:

His Excellency the Governor-General in Council

Pursuant to section 175 of the Fisheries Act 1996, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Fisheries, and on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

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Order

- 1 Title**
This order is the Fisheries (Kawhia Aotea Taiapure) Order 2000.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Kawhia Aotea taiapure constituted

The New Zealand fisheries waters (being estuarine or littoral coastal waters) described in the Schedule are a taiapure-local fishery.

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Schedule
Kawhia Aotea taiapure

All the waters in Area 1 plus all the waters in Area 2.

Area 1

All the marine and estuarine waters enclosed by a line—

- (a) commencing from the mean high-water mark at Taranaki Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 37°58.6'S, 174°46.8'E); then
- (b) following an arc of 2 nautical miles radius seaward from Potahi Point (at 38°0.5'S, 174°47.7'E) to a point 38°1.8'S, 174°46.0'E; then
- (c) proceeding in a southerly direction in a straight line to a point 38°3.5'S, 174°45.5'E; then
- (d) proceeding along an arc within a radius of 2 nautical miles seaward from Urawhitiki Point (at 38°5.37'S, 174°46.22'E) to a point 38°6.2'S, 174°43.8'E; then
- (e) proceeding westerly along a line 1 nautical mile from the mean high-water mark to a point 38°5.7'S, 174°41.1'E; then
- (f) proceeding southerly in a straight line to the mean high-water mark at Albatross Point on the west coast of the North Island (at 38°6.7'S, 174°41.1'E); then
- (g) proceeding easterly along the mean high-water mark of the coast and within the waters of Kawhia Harbour to Waiharakeke Stream (at 38°9.11'S, 174°51.35'E); then
- (h) proceeding to Awaroa River (at 38°5.48'S, 174°55.22'E); then
- (i) proceeding northerly to Te Kauri Stream (at 38°4.5'S, 174°55.26'E); then

- (j) proceeding to Oparau Stream (at 38°3.15'S, 174°54.67'E); then
- (k) proceeding westerly to Mangaroa Stream (at 38°2.3'S, 174°51.51'E); then
- (l) proceeding to Manawatuhatuha Stream (at 38°2.47'S, 174°50.41'E); then
- (m) proceeding northerly along the mean high-water mark of the coast and easterly within the waters of Aotea Harbour to Makomako Stream (at 37°57.8'S, 174°53.84'E); then
- (n) proceeding northerly to Pakoka Stream (at 37°55.92'S, 174°51.13'E); then
- (o) proceeding westerly and northerly to the point of commencement at the mean high-water mark at Taranaki Point (at 37°58.6'S, 174°46.8'E).

Area 2

All the marine and estuarine waters within 1 nautical mile radius centred on Gannet Island (at 37°58.3'S, 174°34.0'E).
