THE FRESHWATER FISHERIES REGULATIONS 1951,  
AMENDMENT NO. 8

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 16th day of September  
1964

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 8 and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. (1) Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "close season", and substituting the following definition:

"'Close season' means, in respect of any part of any district, the portion of any year which is not included in the open season for that part:".

(2) Regulation 2 (1) of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking the definition of the term "open season", and substituting the following definition:

"'Open season' means the period from the 1st day of October in any year to the 30th day of April in the year next following (both days inclusive) during which fishing for acclimatised fish is generally permitted, or, in respect of any acclimatisation district or any part or parts thereof, or, in respect of any particular species of fish either generally or in any water or waters, such other period or periods in which from time to time fishing may be permitted by local regulations:".

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 28B (as inserted by regulation 3 (1) of the Freshwater Fisheries Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 5), the following regulations:

"28c. Each acclimatisation society whose district is in the North Island shall pay to the Council of North Island Acclimatisation Societies the sum of 6s. in respect of each whole-season licence issued by the society at the fee specified in the fourth column of the First Schedule hereto.

"28b. (1) The Council of North Island Acclimatisation Societies shall establish a fund to be known as the Fisheries Pool Fund.

"(2) All amounts paid to the Council under regulation 28c of these regulations shall be paid into the Fisheries Pool Fund.

"(3) Money in the Fisheries Pool Fund may be applied by the Council—

"(a) In making grants to acclimatisation societies whose district is in the North Island to be used for the purpose of ranging and management of freshwater fisheries:

"(b) In reimbursing expenditure incurred by the Crown under arrangements made with the Council:

"(c) For any other purpose in relation to freshwater fisheries research, investigation, and management in the North Island, whether by way of grant to individual societies or otherwise,—  
and for no other purpose."

4. (1) The regulations specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

(2) Regulation 4 of the Fisheries Experimental Waters (Lake Waingata) Regulations 1962\* is hereby amended by omitting the words "during any open season or winter season".

(3) The Hawke's Bay (Winter Season and Fisheries Experimental Waters) Fishing Regulations 1963† are hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from regulation 10 the words "in addition to being the holder of a winter-season licence under these regulations, he is also", and substituting the words "he is":

(b) By omitting from regulation 13 the word "winter-season".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

Regulation 2 amends the principal regulations to give effect to the provisions of section 93 of the Fisheries Act 1908 (as substituted by section 27 of the Fisheries Amendment Act 1963), which empowers the Minister to alter the duration of the open season, to alter the dates of the commencement and termination of the close season, and to dispense with a close season.

Regulation 3 provides that each acclimatisation society in the North Island must pay to the Council of North Island Acclimatisation Societies the sum of 6s. in respect of each whole-season licence issued by the society at the fee of £2 10s. These amounts are to be paid by the Council into a Fisheries Pool Fund, and applied only in making grants to societies for ranging and freshwater fisheries management, in reimbursing expenditure incurred by the Crown under arrangements made with the Council, or for the purposes of freshwater fisheries research, investigation, or management in the North Island.

Regulation 4 revokes various winter-season regulations, as the seasons may now be extended or dispensed with by the Minister of Marine by Fisheries Modification Notices.
