Regulations

1 Title

- (1) These regulations are the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Amendment Regulations 2001.
- (2) In these regulations, the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999¹ are called “the principal regulations”.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 October 2001.

3 New regulation 44 substituted

“44 Penalties

A person who commits an offence against these regulations is liable as follows:

- “(a) on the first occasion on which the person is convicted of 1 or more offences, the person is liable in respect of that offence or each of those offences (as the case may be) to a fine not exceeding \$10,000;
- “(b) on every subsequent occasion on which the person is convicted of 1 or more offences, the person is liable in respect of that offence or each of those offences (as the case may be) to a fine not exceeding \$20,000.”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 October 2001, amend the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999 by increasing the maximum fines from \$5,000 (first offences) and \$10,000 (subsequent offences) to \$10,000 and \$20,000 respectively.
