**THE FISHERIES (DOLPHIN PROTECTION) REGULATIONS
1956**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of March 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Fisheries Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Dolphin Protection) Regulations 1956.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. During the period of five years from the commencement of these regulations it shall not be lawful for any person to take or molest any dolphin in the Hokianga Harbour, being all that area of tidal land and tidal water inside the seaward arc of a circle having a radius of two nautical miles from the signal station on the South Head at the entrance to the said harbour.

3. Any person committing a breach of these regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £50.
