



Gaming and Lotteries (Problem Gambling Levy) Regulations 2002

Order in Council

At Wellington this 23rd day of July 2002

Present:

Her Excellency the Governor-General in Council

Pursuant to section 116ZP of the Gaming and Lotteries Act 1977, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister of Internal Affairs, makes the following regulations.

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Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the Gaming and Lotteries (Problem Gambling Levy) Regulations 2002.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 October 2002.

3 Interpretation

In these regulations,—

Act means the Gaming and Lotteries Act 1977

society means—

- (a) any corporation sole, association of persons (whether incorporated or not), or a local or affiliated branch of any such association, that is established and conducted entirely for any purpose other than a commercial one; and
- (b) a society, as defined in paragraph (a), that is licensed under section 8 of the Act to conduct a game of chance involving the use of 1 or more gaming machines.

4 Problem gambling levy

- (1) Every society must pay to the Secretary for Internal Affairs a levy of \$297 for each gaming machine subject to its licence.
- (2) The levy is due and payable on the issue or renewal of the licence.

5 GST included

The levy prescribed by regulation 4(1) is inclusive of goods and services tax.

6 Revocation

The Gaming and Lotteries (Problem Gambling Levy) Regulations 2001 (SR 2001/223) are revoked.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations prescribe the levy payable towards the funds of the problem gambling committee, approved under Part VIIA of the Gaming and Lotteries Act 1977, by societies licensed to conduct games of chance involving the use of gaming machines. The levy is

\$297 for each gaming machine that is subject to the society's licence. The regulations come into force on 1 October 2002.
