



THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS CLASSIFICATION AND PAY REGULATIONS 1942, AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 21st day of
November, 1945

Present :

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act, 1926, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways Classification and Pay Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Government Railways Classification and Pay Regulations 1942* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Except as herein otherwise provided, these regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 30th day of June, 1944.

3. Regulations 18 and 19 of the principal regulations are amended by omitting the respective references to "Grade 8", and substituting in each case a reference to "Grade 7".

4. Regulation 20 of the principal regulations is amended—

(a) By omitting the reference to "Grade 7", and substituting a reference to "Grade 6";

(b) By omitting the words "to a higher grade", and substituting the words "beyond Subgrade 6 of that grade".

5. The principal regulations are amended by adding, next after Regulation 21, the following regulation:—

"21A. (1) If any member who for the time being is classified in Subgrade 6 of Grade 6 and is under the necessity of passing the examination specified in Regulation 20 in order to be eligible for promotion as therein provided, has heretofore failed or hereafter fails to pass the same within the five years next following the latest date on which, in the opinion of the General Manager, such member ought to have passed the same in order to be eligible for promotion as aforesaid at the appropriate stage of his service, then the General Manager may review such member's work and conduct over such period as he deems desirable and, if satisfied therewith, may promote such member to Subgrade 7 of Grade 6, either forthwith or, in his discretion, at some later date.

“(2) Subject to satisfactory work and conduct, such member may then be permitted to advance as far as Subgrade 9 of Grade 6 in the usual course with other members in the grade, but shall not be promoted to any grade higher than Grade 6 unless and until he passes the examination specified in Regulation 20.

“(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of October, 1945.”

6. The First Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—
