THE GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS (STAFF) REGULATIONS
1953, AMENDMENT NO. 12

THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH, G.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Government Railways Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 12, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 70, the following heading and regulation:

“Recreational Leave

“70A. In addition to any other leave which he may be granted an administrative officer may be granted one day off duty on pay in each leave year for recreational purposes. Leave granted pursuant to this regulation shall be on such terms and conditions as the General Manager may from time to time determine.”

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 104.

4. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 138, and substituting the following regulation:

“138. Instead of the retiring leave which may be prescribed for an employee, the General Manager may grant an allowance not exceeding an amount equivalent to half the value of the retiring leave, computed at the employee’s classified salary or classified rate of wages, as the case may be, on the day he ceases duty.”

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulations 214 and 215 and the headings to those regulations, and substituting the following heading and regulation:

“Free Passes for Families of Retiring Employees

“214. A retiring member or a retiring temporary employee who is granted retiring leave or an allowance instead of retiring leave may, on application, be granted all lines passes in favour of his wife and dependent children. The all lines passes shall be available for a period not exceeding three months, which period of availability may commence at any date not later than six months after the date on which the retiring leave of the retiring member or retiring temporary employee, as the case may be, commences or would have commenced had he not elected to receive an allowance instead of the leave.”

6. (1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, as substituted by regulation 2 of the Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 11, and substituting the First Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) The Government Railways (Staff) Regulations 1953, Amendment No. 11, are hereby revoked.

(3) This regulation shall be deemed to have come into force on the 12th day of October 1959.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide a new scale of salaries for administrative officers in the Department. They also provide that a retiring temporary employee may be granted a lump sum payment instead of retiring leave and for the issue of a retiring leave pass to his family. They also provide for the grant of recreational leave to administrative officers and for the revocation of a regulation which is no longer of any effect.

These regulations are administered in the Government Railways Department.
