1 Title

- (1) This order is the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Amendment Order 2000.
- (2) In this order, the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Order 1990¹ is called “the principal order”.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

3 Blackcurrants declared to be a prescribed product

Clause 3 of the principal order is amended by omitting the item “Blackcurrants (*Ribes* spp.)”, and substituting the item “Blackcurrant, fruit of *Ribes* spp.”

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, amends the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Blackcurrants) Order 1990 by changing the item relating to the definition of blackcurrants to reflect the distinction between the plants and the fruits of those plants.
