(BOYSENBERRIES) ORDER 1990**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 29th day of January 1990

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 24 of the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the recommendation of the Minister of Agriculture and the Minister of Overseas Trade and Marketing made in compliance with section 25 of that Act, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Horticultural Prescribed Products (Boysenberries) Order 1990.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Interpretation—In this order—

“The Act” means the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987;

“Boysenberries” means the product specified in clause 3 of this order.

3. Boysenberries declared to be prescribed product—The following product is hereby declared to be a prescribed product for the purposes of the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987:

Boysenberries (*Rubus hybrid Boysen*).

4. Boysenberries to be subject to export licensing—Boysenberries are hereby declared to be subject to export licensing in accordance with Part III of the Act on and from the 1st day of July 1990.

5. Recognised product group—Berryfruit Export (NZ) Limited is hereby declared to be the product group recognised under section 25 of the Act as suitable to carry out the functions of a recognised product group in relation to boysenberries.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*, declares boysenberries to be a prescribed product for the purposes of the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987 and declares Berryfruit Export (NZ) Limited to be the relevant recognised product group.

The order also declares that boysenberries are to be subject to export licensing in accordance with Part III of the New Zealand Horticulture Export Authority Act 1987 on and from 1 July 1990. Boysenberries are presently subject to the Berryfruit Marketing Licensing Regulations 1983 and will be removed from the ambit of those regulations on 1 July 1990 by the Berryfruit Marketing Licensing Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 4.
