2 Commencement of Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003

- (1) Section 5(1) and Part 11 of the Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003 come into force on 1 July 2004.
- (2) The rest of the Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003 comes into force on 1 September 2004.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order brings—

- section 5(1) and Part 11 of the Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003 into force on 1 July 2004; and
- the rest of the Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003 into force on 1 September 2004.

Section 5(1) of the Intellectual Disability (Compulsory Care and Rehabilitation) Act 2003 concerns interpretation and Part 11 of that Act provides for matters relating to administration.
