## THE MOTOR-DRIVERS REGULATIONS 1940, AMENDMENT NO. 2

# C. L. N. NEWALL, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 18th day of December, 1945

#### Present:

THE RIGHT HON. P. FRASER PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Motor-drivers Regulations 1940, Amendment No. 2.
- 2. These regulations shall be read together with and form part of the Motor-drivers Regulations 1940\* (hereinafter called the principal regulations).
- **3.** These regulations shall come into force on the seventh day after notification in the *Gazette* of the making hereof.
- 4. Clause (1) of Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is amended by revoking the words "three months" where they twice occur, and substituting therefor the words "twelve months" in each case.
- 5. Clause (2) of Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is amended by adding at the end thereof the following words: "or, so far as they apply to heavy trade motors, to any person over the age of fourteen years who drives such a heavy trade motor in the course of his employment on a farm or market garden and is exempted in writing by the Minister of Transport".
